GETTING MORE OUT OF YOUR SUNDAY SERVICE

Take some time this week to go over the thoughts and questions below from Pastor Ronnie's sermon titled, "MORE THAN A MEAL" (Luke 22:7-20). Consider them on your own, with a friend or schedule a family discussion time.

1. Pastor Ronnie talked about preparing our hearts for Communion. One aspect of being prepared is to repair any broken relationships. Do you have any divisions in your life? Read Matthew 6:14-15. Spend time reflecting on your relationships and ask God to expose any areas of your life where you are struggling to forgive and let go of being wronged in the past.
2. Go back to the beginning of your relationship with God. It's always encouraging to take time to remember where it all started. Reflect on the moment you accepted Christ into your heart. Can you remember the first time you took of communion? Share or simply reflect on excitement and fullness that you had in the beginning of your relationship with Christ.
3. During this season of separation, it can be easy to lose our joy. Pastor Ronnie reminded us that we are locked in with the Lamb of God and covered by His blood. We may be distanced from family and friends, but we need to stay locked in to our relationship with Jesus. Remember to celebrate and enjoy the work of our Savior in our lives. Reflect on His awesomeness by reading John 1:14, Isaiah 9:6, Hebrews 4:15. How do you want to enjoy Jesus today?

WHAT'S NEXT: If you or someone in your home or friendship circle are not locked in to the love of Jesus, take a few moments to write down or discuss something that brings you joy. (ex: I am thankful for the sunny days, Church Online, a slower pace to be refreshed, etc...) Change focus! The love of Jesus is more than enough.

GOING DEEPER: Review Pastor Ronnie's message and write out the definition for the three types of sin: Transgression, Trespass & Iniquity. If you are willing to pray and ask for forgiveness from your sin, then you are a candidate for the Zoe life.
